**Impact and sustainability**

The Government continues to provide additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding – provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – will be allocated to primary school head teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

In our school there is a strong belief that active children are happy children. Along with many other factors, we believe that the academic success that our children achieve throughout the school is strongly impacted by the opportunities they have to lead an active and healthy lifestyle through taking part in high quality P.E. lessons and extra-curricular activities. Children who are provided with positive experiences of sport at a primary school age are much more likely to lead active and healthy lifestyles later in life. We consider our role in providing these positive experiences vital to the children's wellbeing, both in the present day and in the future with competitive experiences throughout their time at school, from intra-school sports days, through to local sporting activities. Our sporting provision is enhanced by group camps and away days throughout the school which allow children the opportunity to experience spending time away from home with their friends, working on a range of adventurous activities and developing their self-esteem, confidence and their ability to work well as part of a team.
