Facts from the report highlight:

- Youngsters 5-15 are spending up to 15 hours each week online
- Children aged 3-4 are spending more than 8 hours a week online
- 73% of youngsters (5-15) use YouTube
- 4/10 8-11 year olds claim they prefer watching YouTube to the television
